




Annexation 1 – by Petition

- . Benefits:
 - Open Space Acquisition from State Land Office
 - 694 acres
 - Access from County Road 2 which needs a ³/₄ mile Extension
 - Infill in Southwest Corner of Town
 - 251 acres Reducing the cost for the County for Police, Animal Control, and helping eliminate the confusion for E911 dispatch service.










Sewer System

- Groundwater protection of the Estancia Basin Aquifer
 - Protection of water quality for future generations
 - Possibilities of effluent reuse for parks and public right-of-way
- Economic Development for Edgewood & Santa Fe County
 - Increased property values and PROPERTY TAX Wal-Mart
 - New Businesses Increase in GRT Wal-Mart
 - Employment opportunities for Santa Fe County residents

Joint Programs - Two Existing

2. Youth Programs:

Edgewood received \$52,000 last year for its summer youth program.

4. RECC:

JPA requires Edgewood to provide \$95,000 per year to the County. This is in addition to the RECC GRT which the County receives. The Edgewood District has provided \$542,000 in RECC GRT in 2 years.

Possible New Program: Regional Animal Shelter T.B.D.




Requested Joint Program - Library

- JPA has been written for the County to provide \$20,000 per year for the library (half the lease). (Lease is in the County Attorney's Office)
- The operating budget is \$143,000 per year.

Conclusion:

Edgewood would like to receive more than \$20,000 per year.

Note: According to the County Budget, the Eldorado Library received \$80,000 in 2008.




Requested Joint Program - Sewer

- County is already benefiting from the sewer:
 - increased GRT of \$415,000 per year (because Walmart came)
 - additional property tax base (Walmart)
 - increased Employment Opportunities (>450 jobs)
- County has already received \$1,134,000 from Edgewood District from the Capital Outlay GRT in 6 years time.

Conclusion:

Edgewood would like to receive funding for the sewer which the Capital Outlay Ordinance promised.



Summary

- Edgewood is doing significant Infill Annexations, thereby reducing the cost for the County to provide services.
- The Edgewood Tax District generates a significant amount of GRT revenue to the County.
- The County is already benefiting from the sewer because of Walmart, which came because the sewer is being built.
